





David and Elizabeth Smith (1835-1922) (1838-1921)

David fought in the Civil War and was a charter member of the Frank Reed Post #409 Grand Army of the Republic. Elizabeth was a charter member of the G.A.R. Women's Auxiliary. David was a staunch friend of Congressman Joseph Cannon whom he had known for more than 50 years. About 1900 Mr. Cannon secured him a position in the Government Printing office at Washington D.C., where he spent 10 years of his life. David helped build the Terre Haute and St. Louis railroad. He always said he was "part owner" of that road, as he had about \$100 invested in it, back about 1857. The paymaster ran off with the payroll. Unfortunately, the "investment" never paid any "dividends" as the payroll was never recovered.



William and Anna Sievers Leonard (1862-1923) (1867-1955)
William was a farmer and contractor. He built houses and barns. William and Anna had 15 children, 11 of which grew to adulthood.






